Riff Raff

Saskatoon classic rock band Riff Raff returns to the stage. Veterans of the Canadian nightclub circuit, the band toured all across Canada during the eighties before disbanding in 1989. In March of 1999, the members reunited to perform at a Telemiracle fundraiser. "That was such a great time," says lead vocalist Rory Lawford, "the audience went wild. Saskatchewan is really getting into the classic hard rock sound again, even the younger crowd. This is just way too much fun, so we decided to reunite on a more permanent basis."

Riff Raff's set ranges the gamut of classic hard rock from the late 70's & 80's, (including songs from AC/DC, Nazareth, Alice Cooper, Sweet, Kiss, Iron Maiden, Twisted Sister, Judas Priest & Metallica). "We are a party band," says lead guitarist Brian Kendall, "we don't just play the songs, we like to put on a show." Bucking the trend of dour, angry modern rockers, Riff Raff's live show is a freewheeling, high energy party where everyone is invited to join in on the fun.

McLean lives in Winnipeg, a city on the eastern edge of the Canadian prairies. It's a part of Canada that's noted for its hard winters, large mosquito population in the summer, the warmth and hospitality of its residents and the fact that many artists have left, including Neil Young and Loreena McKennitt, to seek greener pastures.

In the 28 years he's been part of the Canadian music scene, McLean surprisingly made only one album prior to being signed to Stony Plain (For the Blues - Always SPCD1249). "We did it live at Bud's On Broadway in Saskatoon, back in '89 and we called it Muddy Waters for President and we sell it off stage at gigs."

The range of music on his last al-

bum for Stony Plain record speaks for McLean's own eclectic blues tastes; he's a player who gives equal justice to Elmore James, Mississippi John Hurt and Little Walter.

Colin James, one of Canada's best known blues artists and producer of McLean's, For the Blues - Always, was happy to put himself in the picture.

"Dave McLean has been stalwartly keeping up the blues tradition for years," says James. "I first heard him when I was nine, he blew me away then and he still does today. He's one of the great undiscovered bluesmen and people turn out to hear him.

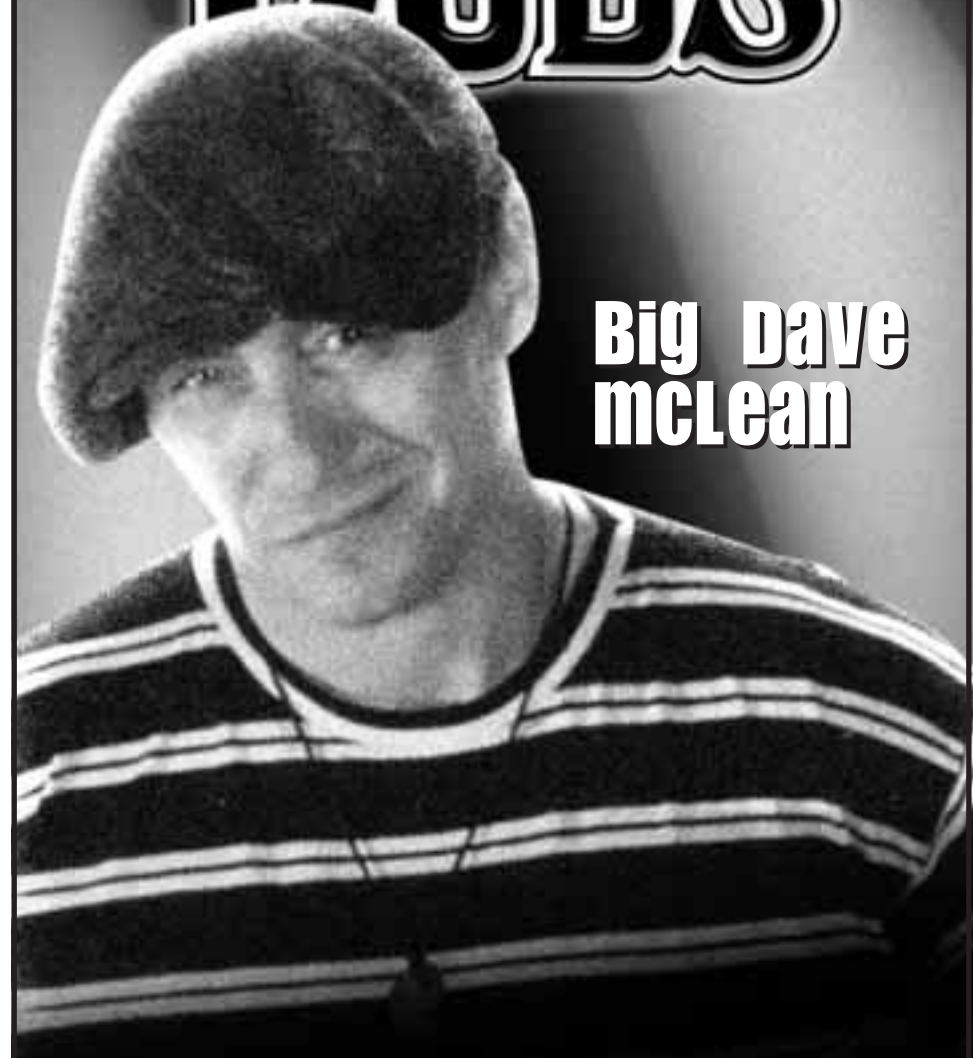
