Since its inception in 1999, Parlor Trixx has been delighting audiences everywhere with their bold form of melodic hard rock. In some ways, their music is a throwback to the late 1980's and the decadence and excesses that accompanied those times. In others, it's simply a refusal to conform to current trends, treading a path upon which most bands are afraid to step.
